Road accidents are one of the leading causes of serious accidents at the Company. It is crucial to remain vigilant behind the wheel.

For many years, our initiatives to reduce road accidents have far exceeded local regulations. Our rules and standards are among the most demanding. They apply to everyone: both TotalEnergies employees and contractors.

Nothing can replace prevention.

We have a role to play in making roads safer.

Did You Know?

Between 2016 and 2022, the number of serious accidents involving our own and contractor drivers declined by a factor of **3**.

This proves that our road-safety initiatives have an impact. Let's keep it up!

Actions and commitments

As a major player in mobility worldwide, TotalEnergies is a:

- **Signatory to a national call to action by French businesses** to promote road safety.
- **Member of the Global Road Safety Partnership** to prevent road accidents.
- **Founding member of the United Nations Road Safety Fund.**

The Company has also signed onto the Decade of Action for Road Safety, which has set the ambitious target of preventing at least 50% of road traffic deaths and injuries by 2030.

66%

of our road accidents are caused by risky driving behavior.

These include inappropriate speed, non-compliance with safety distances, fatigue and phoning while driving.

Driver behavior is the leading cause of road accidents, far ahead of external causes such as other drivers, weather and infrastructure (25%) and mechanical problems (5%).

50% of the fatalities in road accidents are pedestrians, cyclists or users of motorized two-wheelers.

Phoning while driving increases by **4** the risk of having an accident, and sending a text message by **23!**

A **5%** rise in average speed increases the number of fatal accidents by around **20%**.

In 2017, we launched a program to raise road safety awareness among employees of the Company and our contractors. Better known as #SafeDriver, this program promotes our individual and collective commitment to safer roads, shares the Company's best practices and guidelines and reports on our progress. It's important to keep up our efforts! The 2023-2024 campaign focuses on three priority driving behaviors.



I keep control of my vehicle at all times

3 out of 10 serious accidents are caused by a failure to adapt to the driving situation

Staying in full control of your vehicle means being able to avoid an obstacle or maintain your trajectory no matter what the situation, configuration or traffic conditions.



I don't drive if I'm tired and I don't allow distractions

2 out of 10 serious accidents are caused by driver fatigue or distraction

Knowing how to drive means knowing when to take breaks. It also means refraining from all other activities when driving.
Never phone or text while driving!



I pay attention to other road users and pedestrians when I'm driving

2 out of 10 serious accidents are caused by other road users' behavior

To prevent hazards, a few simple rules apply: Anticipate other drivers' errors, maintain a good safety distance, keep a close eye out for pedestrians, cyclists and two-wheelers, etc.



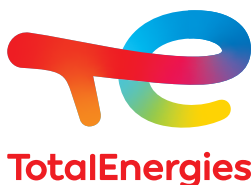
